

# **Did You Know?**

The Weatherization Assistance Program is the nation's largest residential energy efficiency program.

The Weatherization Program was created in 1976 and has served over 7-million families nationally.

Low-income families pay an average of 18% of their annual income for energy, compared with 5% for other households.

Weatherization services save customers an average of \$283 annually.

For Every \$1 invested in the program, Weatherization returns \$4.10 to the household and society.



#### How Does the Process Work?

After completing the application process and providing some required documentation, once eligibility is confirmed you will be placed on a list and a Weatherization Inspector will reach out to schedule your home's energy audit.

#### What is Weatherization?

Weatherization helps your home stay warm in winter and cool in summer by keeping outside air out and inside air in boosting energy efficiency and saving on utility bills. Incomeeligible families receive a free comprehensive home energy audit to identify energy loss and recommend improvements all at no cost to you.



# Types of Assistance:

Weatherization services may include:

- Weatherstripping
- Caulking around doors and windows
- Cleaning, testing, repair or replacement of refrigerators, heating and/or cooling systems
- Adding insulation to walls, ceilings and foundations
- Infiltration reduction around doors and windows

### If I Rent, Can I Still Apply?

Whether you own or rent, live in a singlefamily home, multi-family housing complex, or a mobile home, you can apply for assistance.



# Who is Eligible?

Eligibility is based on how many people live in the home and the household's income level.

If anyone in the household receives one or more of the following sources of income they will be *automatically qualified* for our program.

- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits
- Utility assistance from the Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP)
